CORE Articulation Agreement (2024-2025)

Students who have previously earned an academic associates degree from Berkeley City College at the time of matriculation, will be required to take EC 2000 at Dominican University of California, but all other CORE requirements will be considered met through the AA

Note: All courses are 4 units at Dominican University of California. Berkeley City College 3 unit courses will meet the CORE requirement but not earn 4 units. Transfer courses must earn a C or better.
